b. NRLM - National Rural Livelihood Mission

This scheme was launched by Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India in June 2011. The mission aims at creating efficient and effective institutional platforms of the rural poor enabling them to increase household income through sustainable livelihood enhancements and improved access to financial services. The scheme aims at promoting self-employment of the rural poor through the formation of SHGs. The scheme was launched to overcome the flaws of *Swarnajayanti Gram Swarozgar Yojana* (SGSY). After restructuring of National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM), the scheme has now been renamed as 'Aajeevika'.
