## Academic and Administrative Audit Report for the Academic Session 2020-21

On the request of the Principal, Raniganj Girls' College Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) was conducted by me. Assessment of various aspects related to academics and administration was carried out and the specific findings furnished below:

1. Raniganj Girls' College was established in the year 1980 and since its inception it has been imparting higher education to the girl students belonging to the districts of Pashim Bardhaman, Bankura and Birbhum and the adjoining state of Jharkhand. It began as an affiliated institution offering only undergraduate and higher secondary level courses. However at present it has turned into a post-graduate college of Kazi Nazrul University. Moreover research degree course in Urdu leading to PhD is also offered here.
2. Because of its location in a strategic position and easy approachability by road and railway transport, Raniganj Girls' College has been able to draw in students from the surrounding areas spread over three districts and a neighbouring state.
3. Raniganj Girls' College has adequate number of buildings and required infrastructure for comfortably accommodating all the students in the classrooms. The classrooms are sufficiently equipped in all respects including smartboards and ICT facilities for conducting theory classes.
4. The college has a fairly large body of suitably qualified faculty members however some of the departments are dependent solely on State Aided College Teachers (SACTs).
5. All the science departments have their respective laboratories which are furnished with necessary equipment and apparatuses.
6. Raniganj Girls' College houses a fairly large library with 6205 titles. It is recommended that departments should maintain separate departmental libraries. However, the college needs to subscribe to National and International Journals. In addition, adequate number of reference books are also to be procured by the college. Reprographic facility is available on payment. Library uses the SOUL software.
7. The campus of the college is full of greenery and open spaces. The inclination of the administration towards maintaining a green and clean campus is evident.
8. Given the above findings, I am of the opinion that the college has been successful to a large extent to realise its vision of empowering the girl students by providing quality education to them despite many constraints.
